- · body powder

FIRST AID

- · diarrhea medication (Pepto Bismol, Imodium or Lomotil) some take Pepto-Bismol daily & it has proven to help
- · first aid cream & band-aids
- sunscreen
- mosquito repellent with Deet
- vitamins & personal medications

- tub of granulated Gatorade for hydration (good to drink 1 liter/day)
- sleep aid (for plane & noisy environment)

GENERAL

- · bring a small pillow, pillowcase and flat sheet
- 2 bath towels (thin dries quicker) & 2 wash cloths
- flashlight & extra batteries
- 2 pint size bottles of water for plane ride (use only bottled water to drink & brush teeth, no ice)
- hat with brim
- sunglasses
- · camera & film
- ear plugs (preachers snore, roosters crow, dogs bark)
- adapter/converter (220V-power not always available)
- alarm clock(wind-up)
- 12 heavy duty gallon size Ziplock bags(useful for packing wet cloths, souvenirs & emergencies)
- snacks helpful to have especially if food doesn't agree with you and adjusted a slope

IMPORTANT DOCUMENTS

- · passport & airline tickets should be carried at all times in either money belt or money necklace
- driver's license & one credit card should also be in money belt with cash
- copies of passport should be stored in each piece of baggage
- \$100-200 is more than enough cash for meals en route & souvenirs(traveler's checks not necessary)
- Filipino currency: Philippine Peso Current exchange rate: 46.11 pesos = one dollar
